Series Notes: The HEAT and Clippers meet for the first of two matchups this season. Last season, the two teams split the season-series, 1-1, with each team winning on the road. Miami has won four of the last five games against the Clippers, including the last two consecutive on the road. Additionally, the HEAT has won their last five-straight inside the STAPLES Center between the Clippers and Lakers. The HEAT is 33-20 all-time versus the Clippers during the regular season and is 18-8 in games played in Miami. The HEAT is 15-12 in games played on the road.

UTAH JAZZ 98, MIAMI HEAT 83 (1/9/16): On the second night of a back-to-back set on the road, the Miami HEAT fell to the Jazz, 98-83, in Utah. Goran Dragić scored 11 first quarter points, helping Miami take a 10-point, 29-19, lead after one. Utah shot 52.9 percent from the field in the second, cutting the HEAT lead to four, 49-45, at the half. The Jazz shot even better in the third, this time 64.7 percent as they took a four-point, 72-68, advantage into the final frame. Utah led, 82-78, with 6:16 remaining before going on a 6-0 run to push their lead to double-digits, 88-78, with 4:02 left to play. Miami would score next, cutting the Jazz lead to eight, but would get no closer than that the rest of the way as Utah secured the, 98-83, win. Chris Bosh scored a team-high 24 points as Hassan Whiteside posted a 10-point, 11-rebound double-double. Gordon Hayward led Utah with 34.

MIAMI HEAT 103, PHOENIX SUNS 95 (1/8/16): In the first of six consecutive games on the road, the Miami HEAT recorded a, 103-95, win against the Suns in Phoenix. Goran Dragić, in his return to Phoenix, scored eight first quarter points, helping Miami to a, 21-20, lead after one. The HEAT shot 66.7 percent from the field in the second as Miami pushed their lead to 13, 53-40, at the intermission. Phoenix opened the third on a 25-6 run to take a six-point, 65-59, lead at the 5:28 mark, but the HEAT closed out the quarter with a four-point, 77-73, advantage heading into the final frame. The Suns began the fourth on a 12-4, giving Phoenix a four-point, 85-81, lead with 6:20 left to play, but Miami quickly responded with a 21-6 run of their own as the HEAT held an 11-point, 102-91, lead with 27.9 seconds remaining before closing out the game with the, 103-95, victory. Three Miami players posted 20-point games in Dwyane Wade (27), Dragić (22) and Gerald Green (21) as Brandon Knight led the Suns with 26 points.

NEW YORK KNICKS 98, MIAMI HEAT 90 (1/6/16): The Knicks captured a, 98-90, win against the HEAT, snapping Miami's eight-game winning streak against New York. The Knicks and HEAT exchanged the lead three times in the first before New York took a one-point, 22-21, lead after one. The Knicks shot 66.7 percent from the field in the second as they pushed their lead to eight, 47-39, heading into the break. New York stayed hot in the third, shooting 60 percent from the field as they increased their advantage to 12, 71-59, heading into the final frame. Miami opened the fourth on a 6-2 run, cutting the Knick lead down to eight, 73-65, but would get no closer than that the rest of the way as New York secured the, 98-90, win. Chris Bosh scored a game-high 28 points, but the Knicks shot 55.7 percent for the game while Carmelo Anthony led New York with 25 points.

MIAMI HEAT 103, INDIANA PACERS 100 [OT] (1/4/16): The Miami HEAT rallied from 18 down to defeat the Indiana Pacers, 103-100, in overtime. Indiana jumped out to a 12-2 lead, closing the first up 10, 29-19. Chris Bosh dropped in 10 second quarter points, helping the HEAT cut the lead down to three, 47-44, at the half. The Pacers pushed their lead to 18, 70-52, at the 5:27 mark in the third before taking an eight-point, 74-66, advantage into the final frame. Miami came back to tie the game at 87 apiece with 3:23 left to play as the teams exchanged the lead four times before the HEAT took possession of the ball, down two, 95-93, with 2.7 seconds remaining. On the ensuing play, the ball would be inbounded to Dwyane Wade as he drove to the basket for the game-tying lay-up at the buzzer, forcing overtime. In the extra quarter, Miami took a one-point, 99-98, lead with 3:14 on the clock as the HEAT would not let Indiana take back the lead the rest of the way, securing the, 103-100, victory. Bosh scored a team-high 31 points and grabbed a team-high 11 rebounds as Wade added 27 points. Paul George led the Pacers with 32 points.

MIAMI HEAT 97, WASHINGTON WIZARDS 75 (1/3/16): The Miami HEAT led by as many as 30 before closing out with the, 97-75, win against the Wizards in Washington. Chris Bosh scored 10 first quarter points, helping Miami to a 25-24 lead after one. The HEAT held Washington to just seven total second quarter points, the second-least quarter points in HEAT franchise history, helping Miami take a 19-point, 50-31, lead at the half. The HEAT shot 52.6 percent in the third as they increased their lead to 22, 73-51, heading into the final frame. The Wizards were never able to cut it below 20 throughout the fourth as the HEAT secured the, 97-75, victory. Bosh scored a game-high 23 points as John Wall led the Wizards with 14.

QUICK HITS:

- Head Coach Erik Spoelstra recorded his 200th career home win on 10/28 vs. CHA and has now posted a 214-88 (.709) career record at home since taking over the reins during the 2008-09 season.
- The HEAT's roster has recorded 29 total All-Star appearances (Wade-11, Bosh-10, Stoudemire-6 & Deng-2), tying for the most All-Star appearances in the NBA with the San Antonio Spurs which also has 29 (Duncan-15, Parker-6, Aldridge-4, Ginobili-2 & West-2).
- Miami's 97-95 win vs. OKC on 12/3 had 38 lead changes, marking the second-most lead changes in a game over the last 15 years, only 40 lead changes during the POR-LAC game on 2/12/14 had more.
- Miami held WAS to just seven total second quarter points on 1/3, the second-lowest opponent scoring quarter in franchise history, only the six points during the second quarter at CHI on 11/6/93 is lower.
- Miami has recorded 15 wins at home so far this season, the second-most in the Eastern Conference and tying the fifth-most in the NBA.
- Miami is a perfect 11-0 when holding opponents to under 90 points and 12-1 when holding opponents to under 40 percent from the field.
- The HEAT are 13-1 when recording fewer turnovers and 15-3 this season when out-rebounding their opponent.

AGAINST THE WEST: The HEAT are 11-3 against Western Conference opponents this season, the best record against the West by any Eastern Conference team this season. It also ties as Miami's second-best record against the West through a season's first 14 games in team history with the 2012-13 and 1996-97 teams. Only the 12-2 2013-14 team was better. Additionally, it currently stands as Miami's third-best winning percentage against the Western Conference during a single-season in team history. STEADY IMPROVEMENT: Goran Dragić has increased his scoring, field goal percentage and three-point field goal percentage in each month this season. He is averaging 15.7 points (94 total) while shooting 53.4 percent (39-of-73) from the field and 52.9 percent (9-of-17) from three-point range this month. ON THE ROAD IN JANUARY: The HEAT will play 12 road games during the month of January, the most road contests in January in franchise history, surpassing the previous high of 11 which was set twice, first in 1993-94 (5-6) and then again during the 2009-10 season (5-6).

900: Hassan Whiteside grabbed his 900th rebound in his 82nd game as a member of the HEAT on 1/6 vs. NY, that marks as the fastest to 900 boards in HEAT franchise history, surpassing the previous high of Kevin Willis' 87 games. According to STATS, below are the least amount of games taken to grab 900 rebounds as a member of the HEAT in franchise history.

KABOSH: Chris Bosh has made a team-high 66 three-point field goals this season, already the second-most for a single-season in his career. Additionally, he connected on a career-high nine-straight trey's over a two-game span earlier this season from 12/28 – 12/29 and shot a perfect 5-of-5 from downtown on 12/28 vs. BKN, becoming just the 12th player in HEAT franchise history to be perfect from beyond the arc with at least five attempts in a single game. BLOCK PARTY: Hassan Whiteside has blocked a team-leading 137 shots in his first 36 games this season, the third-most blocks through a player's first 36 games of a season in HEAT history. His 137 blocks are more than four entire teams (DET-136, DAL-132, CLE-130 and WAS-128), all while averaging under 30 minutes per game. Additionally, he has recorded 13 5+ block games this season, already tying for the third-most during a single-season in HEAT franchise history. MOVIN ON UP: Dwyane Wade shot 76.5 percent (13-of-17) from the field on 12/16 at BKN, marking the sixth time that Wade has attempted at least 15 shots from the field and connected on at least 75 percent of those attempts. According to Elias, the six games are the most in the NBA since he entered the league during the 2003-04 season. Additionally, Wade has scored 19,477 career points, ranking 45th on the NBA's all-time scoring list, and 44 points short from tying Walter Davis for 44th place. GUARDING THE RIM: Dwyane Wade has totaled 734 career blocks, the fourth-most by a guard in league history. Only Michael Jordan (893), Tracy McGrady (807) and Vince Carter (763) have more. Additionally, Wade recorded his 676th block vs. CHA on 12/1/13, surpassing Dennis Johnson (675) for the most blocks by a guard 6'4" or shorter in NBA history. By comparison, Johnson recorded his 675th block in 1,100 career games as Wade recorded his 676th block in 679 games, 421 fewer games than Johnson.

DON'T CALL IT A COMEBACK: The HEAT's, 103-100, overtime victory on 1/4 vs. IND marked the fifth time this season Miami has rallied from at least 15 down to record a victory. That already ties as the most during a single-season over the last 19 years in franchise history. Below are the most deficits overcome by at least 15 points during a single-season in team history since the 1997-98 season.

FELIZ NAVIDAD: With their win vs. NO on 12/25, Miami has now recorded an .833 (10-2) winning percentage on Christmas Day, marking the highest in NBA history with at least 10 games played. Additionally, Dwyane Wade has recorded a 10-1 (.909) record on Christmas Day. No other player in NBA history owns a higher winning percentage as high as his on Christmas with at least 10 games played, second on that list belongs to Hall of Famer Slater Martin with an .800 winning percentage (8-2) between 1949-1959.

MULTI-BLOCKS: Hassan Whiteside blocked at least two shots in 21 consecutive games to start this season, and according to STATS, only two players over the last 30 years had a longer streak to start a season. Additionally, he blocked multiple shots in 23-straight overall games, the longest such streak in franchise history. Below are the longest two-block streaks to start a season in NBA history and overall in HEAT history.

FASTEST TO 100: Hassan Whiteside blocked his 100th shot of the season on 12/20 vs. POR, in his 26th game, marking the second-fastest HEAT player to reach 100 blocks in franchise history. Alonzo Mourning is the fastest, having blocked his 100th shot in his 24th game during the 1999-00 season. Below are the fastest players in team history to reach the 100-block plateau.

TERRIFIC TRIO: Chris Bosh (24 points), Dwyane Wade (24 points) and Goran Dragić (22 points) combined to score 70 points at ORL on 12/26, marking their highest scoring output during a single game as teammates. They surpassed their previous high of 64 points on 12/7/15 vs. WAS when Wade scored 26, Dragić dropped in 20 and Bosh added 18.

DYNAMIC DUO: Dwyane Wade recorded 26 points and nine assists as Goran Dragic scored 20 points and dished out nine assists on 12/7 vs. WAS. That marked the third time in HEAT franchise history that a pair of teammates each posted at least 20 points and nine assists during the same game. Wade (30 pts, 9 asts) and Jason Williams (21 pts, 9 asts) previously did so on 3/19/06 at NY as Steve Smith (31 pts, 9 asts) and Grant Long (22 pts, 9 asts) accomplished the feat on 4/4/93 vs. ORL.

FROM THE LINE: Dwyane Wade shot a perfect 10-of-10 from the foul line at ORL on 12/26, marking the 11th time in his career he has been perfect from the charity stripe while taking double-figure attempts during a single game. The last time he achieved the feat was also against Orlando, when he went a perfect 11-of-11 at ORL on 12/29/14.

HOT START: Dwyane Wade started the season connecting on his first 24 free throws before missing his first during the third quarter on 11/3 vs. ATL. In addition to making his last six free throws to end the 2014-15 season, Wade's free throws made streak ended at 30, the second-longest free throws made streak of his career. He was just one short from tying his career-best streak of 31 set from 12/23/14 – 1/4/15.

DEFENSIVE START: The HEAT recorded at least five blocks in each of their first 16 games to start this season from 10/28 – 11/30, the longest such streak to start a season in franchise history. Additionally, the 16-game five-block streak was the longest such overall streak in team history, surpassing the previous longest of 15 consecutive five-block games from 3/28/99 – 4/22/99. Below are the most consecutive games with at least five blocks to start a season and the top five-block overall streaks in HEAT history.

TRIPLE-DOUBLE: Hassan Whiteside posted a 22-point, 14-rebound, 10-block triple-double on 11/17 vs. MIN. He recorded the triple-double through just three quarters (17pts, 13rebs, 10blks), and according to Elias, he became the first player to record a triple-double with blocks through three quarters since Marcus Camby (13 pts, 11 rebs, 10 blks) on 4/19/98. It also marks his second career triple-double after posting 14 points, 13 rebounds and 12 blocks on 1/25/15 at CHI, becoming the only active player in the NBA to record at least two career triple-doubles including blocks.

HEAT LIFERS: HEAT teammates Udonis Haslem and Dwyane Wade are the longest tenured pair of teammates to have made their NBA debut together during the same season in NBA history. Both made their NBA debut during the 2003-04 season and now enter their 13th consecutive season together as they have accumulated three NBA Championships, five Eastern Conference titles, seven division titles and 10 playoff appearances. According to Elias, only two other pair of teammates have debuted and remained together for at least 10 years in NBA history, below is each instance.

THE COMEBACK: The HEAT trailed the Houston Rockets by 21 points, 67-46, with 9:13 remaining in the third quarter before closing the game with a 20-point, 109-89, win on 11/1. According to Elias, the last team to be down by at least 20 points and comeback to win by at least 20 points was over 15 years ago on 3/18/00 when Sacramento was down 23 points before beating the Clippers by 21, 104-83. Dating back to the 2000-01 season, Miami's 21-point comeback win is the third-largest by the HEAT and the second-largest overcome at home. Additionally, Miami's 19-point halftime deficit was the third-largest halftime deficit overcome in franchise history. Below are the largest come from behind victories by the HEAT since the 2000-01 season and Miami's largest halftime deficits overcome in franchise history.

NO FLY ZONE: The HEAT blocked 11 shots vs. UTA on 11/12 and then 12 shots vs. MIN on 11/17, marking just the fifth time in franchise history Miami has recorded double-figure blocks in consecutive games. They previously accomplished the feat on 2/13/98 (10 blks vs. DET) & then 2/15/98 (10 blks at TOR), 1/9/98 (12 blks at DEN) & then 1/11/98 (12 blks at VAN), 2/15/97 (10 blks vs. PHI) & then 2/18/97 (10 blks at PHI) and 11/6/90 (13 blks vs. MIL) & then 11/8/90 (12 blks at NJ). Miami has never recorded double-figure blocks in three consecutive games.

THE STARTERS: The HEAT's starters outscored Minnesota's starters by 52 points (81-29) on 11/5. According to the Associated Press, that marked the largest margin since 12/2/10 when Miami's starters outscored the Cavaliers' starters by 53. Additionally, the HEAT held the Timberwolves starting group below 30 total points, marking the 12th time in HEAT history, including the playoffs, that Miami achieved the feat.

TEAM EFFORT: The HEAT starters have each recorded at least one block in two separate games this season, first on 10/28 vs. CHA and then again on 11/3 vs. ATL. The two games already tie the most for a single season in franchise history. Miami previously had each starter block a shot in two games during the 2011-12, 2004-05, 1993-94 and 1989-90 seasons, but has never accomplished the feat in three games during a single-season. The HEAT starters have now all blocked at least one shot in 15 games in team history.

20-PLUS: Dwyane Wade scored at least 20 points in the first five games to start this season, the fourth-longest 20-point streak to start a season in his career. He previously recorded at least 20 points in his career-best first 10 games of the 2009-10 season while also recording at least 20 points in his first six games on two separate occasions, to start the 2004-05 and 2005-06 seasons.

GREEN LIGHT: Gerald Green connected on five three-point field goals vs. CHA on 10/28, setting a new HEAT franchise record for the most made treys in a season opener. Additionally, his 19 points off the bench tied for the second-highest total by a reserve in a season opener in team history, tying Ray Allen's 19-point season opening game on 10/30/12 vs. BOS. Only Willie Burton has scored more off the bench in a season opener after dropping in 25 points vs. WAS on 11/2/90.



2016 NBA ALL-STAR GAME: Voting has begun for the 2016 NBA All-Star Game. Dwyane Wade, an 11-time All-Star, and Chris Bosh, a 10-time All-Star, lead the Miami roster with the most All-Star appearances. After the NBA second returns on January 7th, Wade is the leading vote getter among East Guards with 562,558 votes while Chris Bosh ranks sixth among East Frontcourt players with 194,429 votes and Hassan Whiteside ranks eighth with 168,549 votes. The all-digital program gives fans everywhere the opportunity to vote by allowing fans to cast their vote daily through Google Search and on NBA.com, on the NBA App, SMS text and various social media networks. Voting will conclude on Monday, January 18 as starters will be announced on January 21. The third round of updates will be announced on January 14. The 65th NBA All-Star Game will take place on Sunday, February 14 at the Air Canada Centre in Toronto.



HEAT HOLIDAY EVENTS: On December 17, Pat Riley and Chris Bosh, hosted a gift giving event for military families at Fisher House while also presenting them with a \$50,000 donation. On December 19, Dwyane Wade held two events, one granting the wish of Make-A-Wish families with a special meet-and-greet and then later that day, he hosted a Christmas "Wish Book" extravaganza of food, fun and games. Also on the 19th, Chris Bosh held his Sixth Annual 'Christmas with Chris Bosh' event with 200 youths at Game Time at Sunset Place featuring games, gifts, food and a Santa's Workshop. On December 21, the entire HEAT team spread holiday cheer by visiting two local children's hospitals. On December 23, Udonis Haslem hosted his Fifth Annual 'Christmas Honor Roll' event at Toys R Us, rewarding 80 underprivileged students for their excellence by providing a shopping spree and other goodies. Also on the 23rd, both Gerald Green and Alonzo Mourning gifted 10 children from the Overtown Youth Center with fishing rods and HEAT goodies at Bill Baggs Park while Justise Winslow hosted 20 middle school kids at Ms. Cheezious for lunch and a holiday gift bag giveaway.

PLAYER TICKET PROGRAM: One of the most generous and trend-setting programs in the NBA, the Miami HEAT's Community Player Ticket Outreach Program will spend the entire 2015-16 regular season reaching out to children and youth less fortunate who typically would only dream of watching a HEAT game live. HEAT players Chris Bosh, Luol Deng, Goran Dragić, Gerald Green, Udonis Haslem, Josh McRoberts, Dwyane Wade and Justise Winslow along with Head Coach Erik Spoelstra and Alonzo Mourning, Vice President of Player Programs, joined forces to donate tickets for every single home game to local charitable organizations that would otherwise not have the means to attend HEAT games. Each player, based upon availability, graciously provides several private "Meet & Greet" opportunities for the groups prior to each HEAT home game, where the players give inspiring talks to the children, sign autographs and take pictures with the group. The participating organizations also attend a private viewing of the team warm-ups. Over the course of the season, the children, many for the first time, will have the opportunity to enjoy a HEAT game, courtesy of their favorite HEAT players and role models.

ERIK SPOELSTRA (Portland), Head Coach

Regular Season Coaching Record: 373-222, currently in 8th Season

Erik Spoelstra, enters his eighth season as head coach of the HEAT and his 22nd as a member of the organization. He was elevated to his current position on April 28, 2008. Spoelstra has rewarded the faith that HEAT President Pat Riley showed in him by garnering six postseason appearances, four division titles, four conference championships and guiding the franchise to back-to-back NBA titles in 2012 and 2013.

In just seven seasons at the helm, Spoelstra has already made his mark on the HEAT record book. He currently holds the postseason franchise records in victories (63), winning percentage (.636), series won (14) and postseason games coached (99) on Miami's all-time list. In regular season play, he finished this past season ranked first in winning percentage (.627) on Miami's all-time list and second in victories (351) and games coached (558).

Since replacing Riley on the HEAT bench, Spoelstra has seen the expectations for the HEAT change dramatically from the time he was appointed head coach in 2008 until now. Throughout his tenure he has remained a steadying influence for his team and its paid huge dividends in return.

When he first took over the head coaching reins in 2008 he was given the task of improving a young team that had been ravaged by injuries the previous season and had won just 15 games. Two years later, after the summer of 2010 in which Miami re-signed Dwyane Wade and acquired All-Stars LeBron James and Chris Bosh, he found himself coaching a highly-talented, veteran group that was the most scrutinized team in the NBA. Spoelstra and his team have proven they are up for the challenge as he guided them to consecutive NBA Championships, four-straight Conference Championships and four consecutive NBA Finals appearances, becoming just the third franchise in NBA history to make four consecutive NBA Finals appearances, joining the Celtics and Lakers. It also made them just one of 10 franchises in the four major North American sports leagues to make four consecutive trips to the league championship. Individually, Spoelstra became just the fourth head coach in NBA history to lead his team to four-straight Finals appearances joining Red Auerbach, K.C. Jones and Pat Riley.

Spoelstra, who was tied for second place on the NBA's all-time postseason winning percentage list last season, joined a very elite fraternity when he led the HEAT to a seven-game series win over the San Antonio Spurs in the 2013 NBA Finals. Upon capturing the 2013 NBA Championship he became one of just 13 head coaches in NBA history to have won multiple championships and only the eighth to win a championship in consecutive seasons.

The 2012 championship culminated a compressed 2011-12 season in which Miami went 46-20 and captured its second consecutive Southeast Division title. The regular season was highlighted by a nine-game win streak (Feb. 10-Mar. 1) with each victory a double-digit win. During that streak the HEAT became the first team to win road games on three consecutive nights (Feb. 12-14) since December of 1979 and the first to win each of those contests by double-digits since the 1970-71 season. That streak keyed an 11-2 record in February for Miami which saw Spoelstra earn Coach of the Month honors for the third time in his career.

Before taking over the reigns as the sixth head coach in HEAT history, Spoelstra had served Miami in a number of roles in his first 13 years. He was originally hired as video coordinator and over the years was promoted to assistant coach/video coordinator, assistant coach/advance scout and assistant coach/director of scouting before ascending to head coach. He made a name for himself around the league with his game preparation and superb attention to detail. In his seven seasons as the HEAT's assistant coach/director of scouting, he had the primary role of developing game plans for upcoming opponents. To that end, he coordinated the video staff and advance scouts while overseeing the development of scouting reports and videos.

In 1992, he graduated from the University of Portland with a degree in communications. While attending Portland, Spoelstra was the starting point guard for four years and was named the West Coast Conference Freshman of the Year in 1989. Upon graduating he spent two years as a player/coach for Tus Herten, a team in the professional sports league of Germany.

He has returned to his native Philippines in four of the last five offseasons to host clinics and promote education, health and wellness to thousands of at-risk youth through grassroots programs and events. The 9-day program in Manila in the summer of 2011 was the largest NBA FIT event ever hosted in Southeast Asia under the NBA Cares umbrella. In the summer of 2012, Coach Spoelstra expanded his reach into other Southeast Asia nations by conducting coaches clinics and other FIT activities in Singapore.

Raised in Portland, OR, Spoelstra, who was inducted into the Jesuit High School Athletic Hall of Fame in September 2009, is the first Asian/Filipino-American head coach in any of the major North American sports leagues.

Spoelstra is the son of Jon Spoelstra, a long-time NBA executive who has guided the Portland Trail Blazers, Denver Nuggets, Buffalo Braves and New Jersey Nets. His grandfather, Watson, was a Detroit Tigers beat writer for many years.
